2. CONCEPT OF VALUES

Therefore, value can be defined as -Anything (material or non-material) socially desired or desirable which satisfies a human need, leading him to a higher ideal of life, is a thing of value. Value can also be defined as something that is valuable in terms of an idea, thing, tradition, behaviour, action or outlook etc. Value involves the process of judgment and selection. A person is required to make a distinction between the desire and desirable value by applying a person's idea. Value is an abstract but it becomes concrete and meaningful through its working in a practical life setting.

3. CONCEPT OF TEACHER EDUCATION

The National Council for Teacher Education has defined teacher education as – A programme of education, research and training of persons to teach from pre-primary to higher education level. Teacher education encompasses teaching skills, sound pedagogical theory and professional skills.

4. CONCEPT OF VALUE-ORIENTED TEACHER EDUCATION

Value-oriented education does not imply only moral education it has a wider connotation and includes all the subjects and all the teachers who can correlate their lessons to higher purpose and meaning in life for their students. It is, therefore, imperative that value-oriented education should be a core of primary as well as secondary education. 5. NEED AND IMPORTANCE OF VALUE-ORIENTED TEACHER EDUCATION

In present time most of all educationists agree that teacher education must be value oriented. Here we discuss the necessity of value oriented teacher education in India in accordance with four points of view-

Who will have regard for a teacher who demands higher fee for private tuition? Who will adore the principals who indulge in frauds and issue false certificates to youngsters? Scams in academic institutions are serious challenge to the credibility and responsibility of educational institutions. Present Scenario of Teacher Education:

Teacher education is an integral part of the educational system. The functions of teacher education programme is to produce good teachers, the good teacher is one who develop proper value system among children. But at present teacher education is isolated and incomplete from society and its aspiration. The present teacher education programme is neither

totally fruitful nor fully irrelevant. It has limited objectives and narrow orientation. An average trainee teacher seeks the immediate and short- term goal of a job and employment. There are some areas in India where the enrolment in Teacher Education is near full, but, the physical presence in the face to face mode is nearly nil. These are exclusively commercial centers than educational. At present, education has been largely commercialized. Return on investment is being estimated in terms of material profit rather than in terms of all round development.

Thus, there are problems of quality perception, quality scaling and quality differentiation in Teacher Education. There is a significant variance between expected and actual quality. This is due to the serious gap in terms of values, which are missing in teacher education. In the age of scientific materialism, teacher education has also adopted more and more scientific and analytical concept and has ignored the holistic human values that make a total man. At present, our teacher education suffers various drawbacks such as- Selection problem, Unavailable facilities, Isolation of teacher's education department, Negative attitude of managements, Poor standard of colleges, Supervision problem, Inadequate Infrastructure of colleges etc.

Teacher Education should be Value Oriented:

Now, it is proved that the teacher has the most pivotal role to play in the pursuit and promotion of human values. As well as it is clear that there are some problems in educational sector such as value crises among the students, value erosion among the teachers, value less teacher education etc. We all know that the teacher changes the students but who can change the teacher himself? Value based teacher education is the only means which can give to our teachers the right direction. So, there is need for value based teacher education in India.

The roles of teacher are very important. They are accepted as the backbone of education system. When the child enters the schools at the age now of four or five, the school and the teachers there have to give him lessons in universal brotherhood, respect for all religions, feeling of honour for our great man, a sense of pride in our national flag, self-dependence, respect for the elders etc. Student learns moral, social, cultural, aesthetic values at school. Thus, proper training of teachers should be arranged, so that the teachers acknowledged of their responsibilities.

Also, the country needs teachers with vision-as good teachers make good schools and a good nation. Teachers have to be competent and be committed to their task of nation building by developing values in the future citizens. Therefore, teachers' will have to provide learning experiences for holistic development of mind, body intellect and emotions. So the challenge of teacher education will be to prepare such teachers as can take care of the holistic education of students. This will require value oriented teacher education.

6. CONCLUSION

Now, it is very much clear that why the value oriented teacher education is essential for the fulfillment of national and social aspirations. Teachers are the greatest assets of any education system. They stand in the interface of the transmission of knowledge, skills and values. But the original picture is that teachers aren't trained well enough in how to inculcate values effectively into their classroom. Teachers have failed in their responsibilities. The teacher educators are not being clearly oriented to the national values, ideas and ideologies. Thus it is proper time to identify the major causes of declining ethical values in Indian teacher education system. The only way to overcome this decline is in providing value-orientation in Indian teacher education field. In India, it is necessary to increase ethical values, philosophical thinking, study, research and moral development in education system. From the foregoing discussion it can be concluded that to make education more responsive to the new immerging need of society, teacher education has to be reoriented by values.
